**Fossil Fuel Divestment Session**. The Climate Justice Working Group is hosting an important session on ways to divest from fossil fuels on Tuesday, Sept. 27, 7–8:30 p. Buff Grace, Director of Faith Networks at Minnesota Interfaith Power and Light, will provide an enlightening presentation, and this will be followed by active discussion. Buff will frame this discussion from a faith perspective and describe how faith communities can impact climate change and help heal the world. He will focus on ways we might divest from fossil fuels especially at a personal level but will provide an institutional context as well. We plan to meet in person and encourage that for the best experience, however we will also make participation available via Zoom.
