

2nd **Hour Today:** "Electrification." A resolution was passed by the MN Conference UCC that calls for us to plan for the electrification of our homes and church buildings. We are being asked to support the resolution as a congregation so that it can be brought to the UCC General Synod (our denomination's national meeting). Dwight Wagenius, Community Minister at Mayflower UCC, and one of the resolution's authors, will be our guest presenter as we learn about this issue. Copies of the resolution are available in the back of the Sanctuary.

Dedication of Pledges. On Sunday Nov. 6 during worship we will be dedicating our pledges for the ministry of First Church and for reparations, in 2023. Public Education Resolution. New Brighton UCC is asking for our support by co-sponsoring a resolution supporting public education and educators: "A Resolution Supporting Public School Educators, Academic Freedom, and Equity Efforts in Schools." Our MN conference UCC overwhelmingly approved the resolution and would like to send it on to the General Synod at our national meeting. This requires five "concurring congregations." With news of book banning, teachers' curriculum being questioned, and words being banished from classrooms it makes sense that the UCC would speak to these outrages. Academic freedom is in danger. This resolution speaks clearly to the need/right of every student to be valued and places that responsibility in the hands of professionals, i.e., our public-school teachers

Supporting Each Other. Occasionally a member of our congregational community reaches out to Jane or to the Congregational Care Team looking for some specific help. The nature of the request can vary—doing a household chore, cooking a meal, or simply visiting or even calling. The Congregational Care Team is creating a list of people willing to help in some of these situations. When a request comes in Jane will email the list, taking into account preferences the person receiving assistance has about who is contacted. Anyone who can fulfill the need will reply saying they will offer the necessary support. If the task or the timing is bad for you, no worries!

Support the People's Climate and Equity Plan! On Nov. 6 at 3p, we are invited to join with interns from MN 350 to door knock to get the word out about the People's Climate and Equity Plan in the neighborhood around church. Please let Jane know if you can help with this.

Background: Minneapolis is in the process of updating their 10-year Climate Action Plan. With new federal dollars available starting in January, the city has the opportunity to completely transform Minneapolis. The People's Climate & Equity fund, together with Inflation Reduction Act funding, would allow Minneapolis to make 100% carbon-free buildings, clean transportation, and stable, healthy neighborhoods available to everyone, no exceptions. Investing in access for all makes the transition to clean energy faster and builds more wealth in our communities. It also allows us to make sure clean energy jobs pay well and to tap into new renewable resources like networked geothermal. More information about the plan is available at the back of the sanctuary.

Social media working group. One of our goals this year as a congregation is to be more visible in our community. One dimension of this visibility is making ourselves known more consistently and effectively on social media. In particular, we want to develop a more robust presence on Instagram, and to find ways to amplify our presence on YouTube. In cooperation with the Hospitality and Engagement Team, Jane is looking for a few volunteers who would like to be part of this effort. This would mean committing to some time for training, developing a shared strategy, and eventually taking some time each week to create/distribute social media content for the church.
