We are starting a monthly Election Support Group to give people the opportunity to celebrate, mourn, or just vent about the election process, and also a chance to learn and practice tools for effectively participating in it. We'll pull strategies from resources such as Braver Angels, the Minnesota Council of Churches, and Common Cause. These strategies might include storytelling techniques, suggestions for how to have meaningful conversations with people of differing political beliefs, or ways to advocate effectively for your position. Ideally, you'll walk away with strategies you can use both now and in future elections. We are still determining whether these meetings will be in person or on Zoom, but you don't have to commit to attend every meeting; each session will be standalone.
